Small Business Grant Fund

For attention of film/TV/media businesses: Small business grants of £10,000 are available for all businesses in receipt of small business rates relief. Bristol City Council is currently processing the grants and the first payments have been issued. To find out whether you are eligible, email <u>business.rates@bristol.gov.uk</u>. Alternatively, fill out <u>this simple form</u> on the Council website and the team will check your eligibility against Government guidance. BFI confirms £4.5m of Covid-19 support

Ben Roberts, Chief Executive of the the BFI, has today released a statement outlining how the organisation will support those the industry who have been hardest hit by Covid-19. Measures include a £2m BFI Film Continuation Fund, £1.3m BFI FAN (Film Audience Network) COVID-19 Resilience Fund, £800,000 for BFI-funded features and flexibility for BFI-funded partners. Film & TV Covid-19 Emergency Relief Fund now open

The Film & TV Covid-19 Emergency Relief Fund, delivered by The Film & TV Charity in partnership with the BFI, is open for applications. One-off grants from £500 to £2,500 are available to active behind the scenes workers in film, TV and cinema facing significant financial hardship as a result of the Covid-19 crisis. Applications close 6pm Wednesday 22nd April 2020. Applications are assessed based on need, not when they are received. For more information and to apply, click <u>here</u>.

Repayable Grants Scheme to open next week

A new Repayable Grants Scheme to support freelancers who are waiting for Government support payments will be opened by The Film & TV Charity on Wednesday 15 April. Applicants will have one week to make a claim. Interest free grants of up to £2,000 will be offered to those eligible for Self-employment Income Support but who are struggling with the wait for payments in June. Applicants do not need to provide any guarantees and there is no arrangement fee. Recipients will be asked to repay by the end of September. For more information, click <u>here</u>.

Arts Council England Emergency Response Package now open

Arts Council England has today opened its financial support scheme for artists, creative practitioners and freelancers. In the first round, applicants need to register on Grantium by 13 April to apply before the deadline of 16 April. Up to £2,500 is available for those working in Music, Theatre, Dance, Visual Arts, Literature, Combined Arts, Museums practice, Libraries. Work includes: choreographers, writers, translators, producers, editors, freelance educators in the disciplines and artforms we support, composers, directors, designers, artists, craft makers and curators.
